

GROUP LEADERS

We applaud you for bringing a team to serve abroad in the name of Jesus, what we are training and going after is a genuine form of discipleship, one that involves a cost. As we follow the model set by Jesus, we challenge participants to count the cost and set their eyes on the risen One, who for the joy set before Him paid it all. Keeping in mind what 2 Peter 3:18 states about growing in both the "grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus", we know that growing in each of these births a desire within to become thoughtful and authentic when discovering the Father's plans for us, his kids.

During a normal week at The Mission: RDSN this is what you can expect to be a part of, but as you've heard it said over and over again, being used by God often requires flexibility beyond what comes naturally to us. So see all the following as a framework that may change as we determine to allow the Holy Spirit to move in us regardless of our unmet expectations.

Your team will attend an Orientation where you get to learn a little bit of the history of our ministry and our core values, as well as the need to know items for your stay with us. This will take place either on the day of your arrival or the following morning if your team arrives later in the day.

DURING YOUR TRIP

Visas

Whether we pick you up from the airport or meet and guide you from the border our team will walk you through the Visitor's Visa process at the Mexican Immigration Office. Your online visa forms can only be completed within one month before your arrival date (instructions found on pg. 9). Before applying, please double check that your passport is current. If your passport expires within six months of your arrival date, you will not be able to obtain a visa, and will need to renew your passport.

In order to complete these visas, be sure that <u>each</u> of your team members has a valid passport book or passport card. A valid passport is one that does not expire within 180 days (6 months) of your arrival date. Please note that Enhanced Driver's Licenses (WA) or Real ID's (CA) are <u>not</u> sufficient to obtain a Visitor's Visa in Mexico.

This greatly expedites the immigration process on your arrival day. There are also forms available in the visa office if you are unable to fill them out online Please note that an extended stay visa is required for stays of over seven days, at an additional fee of approximately \$30.00 per person.

Communication & Phones

WiFi is available for purchase by credit card when connecting to our network. This WiFi range only extends to certain areas of campus. International plans are also always available through your wireless carrier. We highly suggest that trip leaders invest in an international plan for the duration of their trip, which allows for important communication with RDSN / The Mission hosts while on your trip.

Using mobile phones in Mexico <u>without</u> making arrangements in advance can result in excessive roaming charges. Many of our group members choose to place their mobile phones on airplane mode to avoid all charges as well as maximise their experience, or at the very least will opt to turn off cellular data upon crossing the border.

For younger teams, such as Christian schools or youth groups, we encourage participants to disconnect from their mobile devices during the trip. We have a high value for being present.

Insuring Your Vehicles

It is recommended that, if you are driving your own vehicles into Mexico, to insure with a Mexican Policy prior to crossing the border. This can be done online through sites like bajabound.com or just before you enter Mexico at a variety of locations near the Tecate, Otay and San Ysidro borders.

Donations & Importing

Please note, upon crossing into Mexico, any purchased supplies or donated items may have an 8% importation tax applied when crossing the border, which your team will be responsible for paying. Used clothing, including hats and shoes, are <u>not</u> permitted to be imported for donation into Mexico. Additionally, Mexico does not allow the importation of fresh produce or other similar food items.

If at the end of your stay you wish to leave items as donations that can be arranged upon your departure.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Housing

We have several group dormitories each equipped with bunk beds and foam pads, which are divided by gender. There are also 4 men's showers, 4 women's showers, and a full restroom that are all shared with our School of Missions students. We simply ask that you join us in using water conservatively and do your very best to keep our campus and facilities clean and damage free.

Please bring hand sanitizer for each of your rooms as it will only be accessible in the shower and restroom facilities.

Meals

Breakfast, lunch and dinner are all served in our dining hall, and for the time being due to Covid-19 restrictions, our kids will not be able to join your team for lunches and dinners. All items served in our kitchen and café are safe for consumption. If someone on your team has food allergies please be sure to talk with them about how to prepare for their stay, as no accommodations will be available in our kitchen.

Additionally, our kitchen staff has incorporated disinfecting protocol between dining times, as well as requiring facemask for entry and at all times when guests are not seated at their specific dining table. Also, expect to have your temperatures checked when entering our dining hall and sanctuary.

Transportation

As you may already know, we have two different transportation options. The first includes stateside transportation from San Diego and crossing the border into Mexico for your stay at RDSN (\$50 per group member). The other simply covers transportation in Mexico and during the different ministries and activities your team will participate in during your stay here (\$25 per group member).

Also, please work with us in planning your arrival and departure days and times for ease.

If you would like our office to book flights for you, we'll need a completed team roster in order to do so. Please let us know if you would like help booking flights as soon as you are able.

When selecting your flights, please book within the following windows* to allow our team sufficient time to get you to your destination:

For your arrival flight, please shoot to land between 9:00AM - 4:00PM PST. For your departing flight, between 12:00PM - 9:00PM PST work best.

*We do our very best to be accommodating for teams. We understand that sometimes there are flights that work better outside of our proposed time frame. \$10 per person fee for any arrival and departures outside of our normal hours.

Finally, there are a few activities that are seasonal and/or dependent on other circumstances, which may or may not be on your schedule, including the History Night and Leader's Coffee.

Special Events and Activities

Activities and outings to **Tacos and Bakery** and even **Rosarito Beach** can be arranged and will likely fall on a Monday, Friday or Saturday but can be arranged another day if your itinerary does not include a Monday, Friday or Saturday.

Payment Timeline

\$200 deposit due two weeks after confirmation of trip dates
50% of balance is due 8 weeks prior to arrival
Payment in full is due 4 weeks prior to arrival
Payments can be made by check or credit card (by phone or online).
Credit card payments are subject to a 5.49% transaction fee.
Short-term mission teams consist of a minimum of 5 paying persons

The \$200 deposit is not refundable, but it is transferable if your team needs to reschedule. All other money received prior to 2 weeks before the trip are refundable/transferable. Changes or cancellations made within 2 weeks of arrival are non-refundable and non-transferable.

This simply gives you an idea of pricing and costs. Team size changes are normal, and you can adjust them up to 2 weeks before your arrival date.

Evangelism Trailer

Our Evangelism Trailer program happens every Tuesday and is a part of our vision for creating a place for communities to come together in family to experience the joy of community and minister hope and healing in a high energy and exciting environment.

The Setting

Evangelism Trailer takes place in the communities that we have strategically selected. The first part of the time is spent outdoors visiting from home to home inviting them to join us at the trailer at the program start time. As you invite people, listen carefully to the Holy Spirit and always look for an open door to speak a word of blessing over each home and family. Back at the trailer you will man a game or activity station for a period of time until the presentation starts, at which time you will clean up your assigned activity area. Skits and testimonies of God's goodness and his plan for salvation and abundant life will be highlighted flowing into a time for prayer.

How You Fit In

During this time you will work with an assigned team under the direction of a team leader and translator. You will participate in specific activities to help prepare your hearts to serve and your minds to be focused on the voice of God in the midst of your serving. You will be challenged to step out and pray using a translator, to play with kids, to interact with strangers under our direct supervision. The key is to have fun and not to be shy, engage with anyone and everyone you can to help prepare their hearts for whatever Jesus has in store for them.

Community Outreach

Community outreach happens every Wednesday afternoon and is a part of our vision for serving our communities. The desire is to get to know them and become a tangible expression of Jesus while providing an opportunity for them to know Jesus and become a part of our church family.

The Setting

Community Outreach takes place in the communities that we have strategically selected. The majority of this time is spent outdoors visiting from home to home offering to clean up or haul away garbage for free. Removing garbage is something families and households would otherwise have to pay for. In meeting this felt need we demonstrate our desire to serve them which often results in an open door to speak a word of blessing over their home and family or even pray with them over specific difficulties they are encountering as a family or individual.

The Schedule

- 2:30 PM A 15 minute training meeting with your ministry leader in the church sanctuary to get directions for the afternoon.
- 2:45 PM Load vehicles and depart to the community.
- 5:00 PM Meet at the bus to load and return to campus.
- 5:30 PM Back on campus.

What to Bring

Work gloves, closed toed to shoes, appropriate clothing for getting dirty.

How You Fit In

During this time you will work with an assigned team under the direction of a team leader and translator. You will participate in specific activities to help prepare your hearts to serve and your minds to be focused on the voice of God in the midst of your serving. You will be challenged to step out and pray using a translator, to play with

kids, to interact with strangers under our direct supervision. You'll also have information on bus routes for church and the nearest connection groups for those you meet who are interested in getting involved.

Connection Group

Connection group happens every Thursday night and is a part of our vision for building community and making strong followers of Jesus.

The Setting

Connection groups happen in 19 different places around the Tijuana area mostly in small, humble Mexican homes. Because of the size of these homes we may have to split your team into smaller groups to accommodate the size of the setting. Groups of 5 are ideal, but we can accommodate larger groups up to 10 in a couple of our locations. Please make sure there is one adult assigned to every group.

The Schedule

- 3:00 PM Meeting with someone from the church team in the church sanctuary to get directions for the night.
 4:00 PM Eat a quick dinner in the dining hall.
 4:30 PM Meet in the bus loading area to go to your connection area.
 5:30 PM Walk around a community ministering to people through conversation and prayer.
 7:00 PM Participate in the Connection Group which usually consists of worship, bible study, testimonies, and prayer.
 8:00 PM Pick you up and return you to Rancho.
- 8:30 PM Return to Rancho.

What to Bring

Please bring a sweatshirt and your Bible. You may want a small amount of money to buy a drink or snacks from a local store.

How You Fit In

During the connection group we encourage you to participate as you would at your own church. Talk to the people; interact with the kids; pray with people. We realize that there will probably be a language barrier- but our church people are loving and patient and there will be a translator available to you. If someone has musical ability, we would welcome 1-2 songs of worship (Spanish preferably). 1-2 people from your group could share a short testimony or devotion with the group. You carry gifts, wisdom, and faith that will bless the people in our church and community- we welcome you to share what God has given you.

Kids' Ministry

As a part of your mission experience at RDSN you will have the opportunity to partner with our church, orphanage and school ministry to kids in the surrounding communities. We have kids who live on our campus, others who spend nearly 12 hours a day in our programs and those who solely join us on Sunday mornings. No matter how much time we have with them our vision is to transform Mexico by impacting the life of one child at a time, making strong followers of Jesus who will in turn impact their family and community.

The Settings

Orphanage (La Cancha) *Currently unavailable for Spring of 2021 due to Covid-19 restrictions

Ministry in this setting takes place on the Cancha of the orphanage, for about two hours under the supervision of our orphanage on-call staff. During this time your team would be working with between 40 and 60 kids, infants through young adults.

While this usually takes place in the afternoon there are occasions when you might spend a morning involved in this ministry. In preparing for this time think about what types of activities, games or short and simple lessons could appeal to the wide age range. Additionally, be creative about ways to involve younger and older children in your planned activities. Finally, remember you won't be left alone so any behavior concerns will always be addressed by our team.

The kids who live at RDSN are mostly placed here by the Mexican government's version of Child Protective Services and may or may not be in the process of reunification with their biological family. We work hard to create a safe and healthy environment while respecting the privacy of our kids, please keep this in mind during your time with them.

Elementary School (La Primaria) *Hosted off campus for the Spring of 2021 due to Covid-19 restrictions

Ministry in this setting takes place on our elementary school playground or in classrooms, for about two hours under the supervision of our Elementary Education Director. During this time your team would be working with between 150 and 200 kids infant through sixth grade. Depending on the size of your team and your preparation it may be possible to split the kids into two groups; lower grades and upper grades, as well as send some of your team to serve in the nursery.

Elementary School ministry always takes place in the afternoon. In preparing for this time think about what types of activities, games or short and simple lessons could appeal to the entire age group, or if your team is more than 20 you can plan two sets of activities and lessons; one for lower grades and one for upper grades. Think about ways to involve kids with different intellectual ability levels and talents. Finally, remember you won't be left alone so any behavior concerns will always be addressed by our team.

The kids who attend our elementary school come from a wide variety of backgrounds, from poverty to middle class and from Christian and non-Christian homes. We work hard to create a safe place for them to be educated and to get to know Jesus. We are always blessed when their families bring us good reports about how their kids have changed since attending our school. All of these kids are bussed in from the communities of east Tijuana, they share two meals a day with us in addition to their traditional school day and after school program.

Kids Church *Facemask required for the 2021 season due to Covid-19 restrictions

Ministry in this setting takes place on Sunday mornings at our Valle church campuses, for about one hour under the supervision of our Kids Ministry team. During this time your team would be working with between 20 and 60 kids kindergarten through sixth grade.

Our kids from the community, sometimes from our school, make up our Sunday morning children's ministry. Keep this in mind when planning activities for Sunday as some of the kids you spent time with during the week will also be present.

The Schedule

Varies depending on setting.

In the orphanage usually 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM or 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM on the weekends.

With elementary school 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM on one or two weekdays, depending on length of stay.

For **kids church** meet with the Ministry Leader at 9:00 AM to go over the program and then go to the chapel when children are dismissed from worship.

What to Bring

When you are with kids depending on the place or time that you have with them, it is always good to be prepared with:

- Supplies for a number of indoor and outdoor games (ie. four corners, soccer)
- An adequate lesson (no more than 15 minutes) to be taught geared toward the age group you'll be with
- When possible a skit or drama illustrating the message or lesson being shared
- A craft or activity that either connects to the lesson or creates space for your team to connect one on one with the children

General Supplies

such as Coloring Books, Crayons, Markers, Sidewalk Chalk, Crafts, Face Paints, Balls (all different types), Balloons, Construction and Craft Paper

How You Fit In

As you take time to plan and prepare for your ministry time with the kids we serve year round at RDSN keep in mind that you will be a physical representation of the love of God toward these kids and toward the nation of Mexico. Our kids may or may not always show it but they are forever impacted by the fact that visitors from around the world have taken time to share life with them , invest in them spiritually and financially and lift them up in prayer throughout the year. You are part of the safety net helping to provide a healthy and whole future for each and every one of the children who make up our programming here at RDSN.
